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## **Motion re Funding**

Motion adopted by the Ontario Public Health Association (OPHA)

Code: 2004-01 (MT) Status: Active

**WHEREAS** every major review of public health nationally and provincially has indicated the need for enhanced and sustainable public health resources;

**AND WHEREAS** the Province of Ontario has committed to increasing public health resources in Operation Health Protection through increasing provincial share cost sharing over the next 4 years to 75% Provincial, 25% Municipal;

**AND WHEREAS** changes to the cost shared ratio without increases in the overall public health budget will not enhance public health infrastructure;

**AND WHEREAS** the province has announced a Health Transformation Agenda which will provide mechanisms for planning and funding health care services on a regional basis;

**THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT** the OPHA advocate that there be no reduction in the municipal contribution for the next four years of Operation Health protection to ensure that the increased provincial share is applied to enhance and sustain the public health infrastructure;

**AND FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED THAT** in implementing the Provincial Health Transformation Agenda, the public health system must be enhanced and strengthened.

**AND** that this position be conveyed to the Government of Ontario, opposition parties, Association of Municipalities of Ontario and alPHa

## **Regarding resolutions, position papers and motions:**

- *Status*: Policy statements (resolutions, position papers and motions) are categorized as: Active, if:
  - 1. The activities outlined in the policy statement's implementation plan have not yet been completed; or
  - 2. The policy statement addresses an issue that is currently relevant to public health in Ontario. **Archived**, if:
  - 1. The activities outlined in the policy statement's implementation plan have been completed; or
  - 2. The policy statement addresses an issue that is not currently relevant to public health in Ontario or is not based upon the most current evidence. The statement remains the position of the OPHA until a new statement is adopted that effectively reverses or essentially negates all or major elements of an earlier statement. In this instance, the former supersedes the latter

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
