Dear Dr. Basrur:

The Ontario Public Health Association (OPHA) would like to commend you on your ongoing commitment to access and equity, highlighted recently during the Question and Answer period of your keynote at the 2004 OPHA Conference. We were particularly pleased to hear your assurance that the Equal Access Standard will be part of the Mandatory Health Programs and Services Guidelines (MHPSG) review.

As you may know, the OPHA Access, Equity and Social Justice Standing Committee has been very active in advocating for changes to the current Equal Access Standard. We believe that in addition to Equal Access continuing as a General Standard, indicators for Equal Access should be developed and integrated throughout the mandatory programs. As a stand-alone general standard, Equal Access is often overlooked and/or difficult to quantify by individual health units.

Attached are the reports from the Equal Access Pilot Project which was led by the Ottawa Public Health. This pilot project built upon the access and equity indicator work of the OPHA Access, Equity and Social Justice Standing Committee. The outcome of this pilot project is a workbook that is now available to health units to help them implement the Equal Access Standard. We are requesting that the Ministry consider the work that has already been done by the Mandatory Programs Measurement Working Group; the OPHA Access, Equity and Social Justice Standing Committee; and the Ottawa Public Health Unit to ensure that the updated Mandatory Programs and Services are developed along with established, valid measures. The OPHA Access, Equity and Social Justice Standing Committee members would also welcome a discussion as to how we can assist the Ministry to move

forward on developing a revised MHPSG that will ensure equitable access to public health programs and services. As a start, we suggest the Ministry consider hosting a forum bringing experts from access and equity, epidemiology and performance management to begin a dialogue about what an integrated MHPSG might look like.
