POSITION SUMMARY:

Working as a member of the Vaccine Preventable Diseases Team (VPD), the incumbent will assist with the delivery of the VPD program as per the <u>Ontario Public Health Standards (2021)</u> throughout the area served by the North Bay Parry Sound District Health Unit. Services provided include but are not limited to community based vaccine clinics including COVID-19 clinics, school based clinics, office based clinics, supporting health care providers in offering publicly funded immunization services in their practices, and cold chain support.

- Working knowledge of the Canadian Immunization Guide and other relevant immunization best practice and guidance resources
- An understanding and working knowledge of Federal, Provincial and Municipal legislation, regulations and standards such as the Health Protection and Promotion Act, Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act, Personal Health Information Protection Act (PHIPA), Health Care Consent Act,

Immunization of School Pupils Act, Child and Family Services Act, Occupational Health and Safety Act, Canadian Community Health Nursing Standards of Practice and the Ontario Public Health Standards (2021)

- Strong clinical documentation skills

- Ability to foster a positive work environment and contribute to a healthy organizational culture
